

## **Do's of Mission LiFE 2022-23 to be followed in the Embassy**

- \* Carry your own water bottle wherever possible.
- \* Re-use glass containers/packaging plastic items as storage boxes.
- \* Prefer using non-plastic eco-frindly cutlery during gatherings and events.
- \* Turn off running taps when not in active use.
- \* Use steel/recyclable plastic lunch boxes and water bodies.
- \* Create kitchen gardens/terrace gardens at offices.
- \* Recycle and re-use and recycle old newspapers, magazines.
- \* Set printer default to double-side printing.
- \* Repair, re-use and recycle old furniture.
- \* Buy paper products made from recycled paper.
- \* Plant trees to deduce the impact of pollution.
- \* Avoid purchasing products/souvenirs made from skin, tuskers and fur of animals.
- \* Initiate and/or join green clubs in your office.
- \* Repair and use electronic devices over discarding the devices.
- \* Prefer cloud storage over a pen drive/hard drive.
- \* Use rechargeable lithium cells.



## **Do's of Mission LiFE 2022-23 to be followed in the Embassy**

- \* Use LED bulbs/tube-lights.
- \* Use public transport wherever possible.
- \* Take the stairs instead of an elevator wherever possible.
- \* Switch off vehicle engines at red lights and railway crossings.
- \* Use bicycles for local or short commute.
- \* Prefer CNG/EV vehicle over petrol/diesel vehicles.
- \* Use carpooling with friends & colleagues.
- \* Drive in the correct gear. Keep your foot off the clutch when changing gears.
- \* Switch off appliances from plug points when not in use.
- \* Keep temperatures of Air Conditioners to 24 degrees.
- \* Keep your electronic device in energy-saving mode.
- \* Use smart switches for appliances which are used frequently.
- \* Use buckets instead of hose pipes to water plants/flowers/vehicles.
- \* Fix leaks in flushes, taps and water pipes.
- \* Use water-efficient fixtures for taps, and shower heads, and toilet flush unit.
- \* Re-use water drained out from AC/RO for watering plants.
- \* Use cloth bag for shopping instead of plastic bags.
